

Shetland Charitable Trust - Main Grant Scheme 2022/23

Organisation	Grant amount £	Purpose
Ability Shetland	40,000	The grant will provide project funding to support a new post of Disability Sports Development Coordinator, with the aim of growing participation in physical activity and sport for people with disabilities.
British Red Cross	23,900	The grant provides core funding towards their Shetland Community Support Service, which has seen increased demand during the COVID 19 crisis and a drop in fundraising opportunities. Their focus is on social isolation and loneliness.
Clan Cancer Support	20,100	The grant provides funding towards a dedicated Children and Families Service in Shetland. This offers support tailored to help children and teenagers through the cancer journey of parents, siblings and other loved ones, as well as specialist support for children with a cancer diagnosis.
COPE Ltd	230,600	The grant provides core funding to allow the organisation to provide focused placements, training, support and employment opportunities to adults with learning and/or physical disabilities.
Dogs Against Drugs	20,500	The grant provides core funding to support their Drugs Education Programme delivered in schools to raise awareness of drugs misuse.
Gaada	43,900	The grant provides core funding to support their wide range of activities in community art with an emphasis on art for individuals with disabilities.
Mind Your Head	76,900	The grant provides core funding to support their services. They provide mental health support for those people below the threshold for medical intervention. In particular, support for those not qualifying for, or not willing to accept statutory support.
Moving On	35,900	The grant provides core funding to support their services. They assist those in need by reason of ill-health, disability, or other disadvantage by developing a service to support people to overcome barriers to employment.
NSPCC Scotland	4,000	The grant provides funding towards an educational schools programme "Speak out Stay safe", teaching primary school children about abuse and neglect, and who they can get support from when something is wrong, including Childline.
OPEN Project	31,300	The grant provides core funding to support their services. They deliver four main activities - Peer Education, Peer Mentoring, Emotional Wellbeing and Resilience Project and OPEN Up (a drop in youth café). Working with young people aged 16 to 25 who are among the most vulnerable and hard to reach. This is overseen by Voluntary Action Shetland.
Relationships Scotland - Shetland	30,600	The grant provides funding towards a Family Connections Project. This project will establish a child contact service to support children to maintain relationships with the parent they no longer live with, or with other extended family members with whom they no longer have contact.
Royal Voluntary Service	64,100	The grant provides core funding towards supporting a range of community projects for elderly and disabled people in Shetland and to increase their proposed service delivery.
Sandwick Social and Economic Development SCIO	15,600	The grant provides funding towards the costs of providing and delivering one hot meal per week, for members of the Sandwick and Dunrossness communities, who are vulnerable, and who would benefit from this service due to their lack of ability, either physical or mental.

Shetland Amenity Trust	1,200,900	The grant provides core funding to support the delivery of their wide range of services in the fields of heritage and culture.
Shetland Arts Development Agency	682,500	The grant provides core funding towards the costs of promoting, developing and delivering activities in the fields of dance, drama, theatre, film, literature, music, crafts and visual arts.
Shetland Befriending Scheme – 16+	13,000	The grant provides core funding towards a befriending scheme for people over the age of 16. The focus is on those who are having difficulty managing their own home and living independently. This is overseen by Voluntary Action Shetland.
Shetland Befriending Scheme – CYP	54,000	The grant provides core funding towards a befriending scheme which offers young people with an opportunity to form a trusting relationship with an adult, to promote the young person's welfare and personal development. This is overseen by Voluntary Action Shetland.
Shetland Community Connections	15,000	The grant provides funding towards additional capacity for their work on Self-Directed Support for those transitioning from childhood to adulthood.
Shetland Islands Citizens Advice Bureau	272,300	The grant provides core funding towards delivering a general information and advice service and the provision of a new service targeting those hardest to reach. Funding will also go towards a dedicated fuel poverty advice service.
Shetland Islands Council Rural Care Model	1,986,200	The grant provides core funding to add value to the community care provided in Shetland, as the level of service is over and above that which would normally be provided by a local authority.
Shetland Link Up	56,700	The grant provides core funding enabling the organisation to offer an informal meeting place to support people who are affected by mental health problems.
Shetland Rape Crisis	33,000	The grant provides core funding to enhance and expand their services. The areas of activity supported are Core Provision, Prevention and Activism Work, Advocacy Service and Emotional and Therapeutic Support Service.
Shetland Recreational Trust	3,225,900	The grant provides core funding to support the cost of leisure and sports facilities at locations throughout Shetland.
Shetland Women's Aid	100,000	The grant provides core funding to enhance and expand the services they deliver. They provide a wide range of support and therapy for women, children and young people as well as a safe place to live, when required.
The Swan Trust	28,300	The grant provides core funding to support the costs associated with maintaining, operating and promoting the Swan sailing vessel.
Voluntary Acton Shetland – Carers Service & Shetland Care Attendant Scheme	75,700	The grant provides core funding to support their services. The Scheme provides short breaks for carers in their own home, through employed Care Attendants going into carers' homes to look after the cared person. This is a partnership project, with funding also supporting Voluntary Action Shetland Carers Service.
Voluntary Action Shetland - Core	88,600	The grant provides core funding towards delivering a central point for advice and information to the voluntary sector in Shetland.
Voluntary Action Shetland – Market House	95,400	The grant provides core funding to support the operation of Market House.
Who Cares? Scotland	35,100	The grant provides funding to continue their work in Shetland supporting children, young people and young adults who have experienced the care system.
